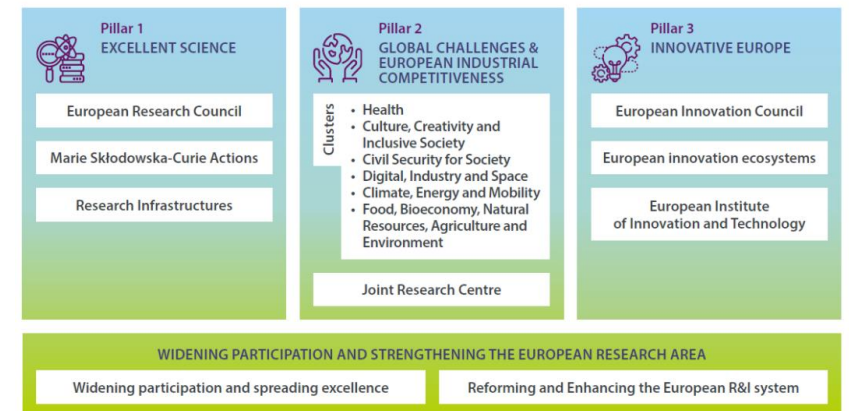

# What is Horizon Europe?

- Horizon Europe is the current EU's Framework Research and Innovation funding programme.
- It is the largest R&I funding programme in the world, with a budget of over £81bn for 2021-27.
- The programme is divided into three main parts:
  - Pillar 1 supports excellence in science
  - Pillar 2 focuses on solving global challenges through collaborative research & innovation
  - Pillar 3 supports business growth and competitiveness
- Other parts of Horizon also include support for research infrastructure and widening participation.
- Key priority areas include food, bioeconomy, climate change, health, digital, transport and mobility, space, energy, industry, civil security and humanities. The programme is open to all types of organisations of all sizes.

# Why International collaboration is important

- Solve global grand challenges through collaborative R&I
- Collaborate with world leading organisations to learn from the best
- Access cutting edge technologies, infrastructure, talent & markets

- Collaborative relationships frequently become transactional ones – developing system solutions in supply chain partnerships

# Update on the Association agreement

- On 7th September, the Prime Minister announced a new UK-EU agreement on the UK's association to Horizon Europe and Copernicus.
- UK applicants are eligible to apply to Horizon Europe calls, now and in the future. The government strongly encourages researchers to do so.
- As set out in the EU/UK Joint Statement of 7 September, all calls within Horizon Europe work programme 2024 and beyond will be funded by the UK's association to Horizon Europe.
- The UK government Horizon Europe guarantee has been extended to cover all remaining Horizon Europe grant calls that are funded under work programme 2023 irrespective of the call closing or grant signature date.

# UK as a ‘Country Associated to the Programme’

‘the Programme’ is Horizon Europe, i.e., UK will be an [Associated Country](#)\* (AC) for the 2024 Work Programme onwards

UK contributes funding to the programme:

- EU decides where to allocate UK government contribution (paragraph 50 of [Regulation establishing Horizon Europe](#)) “When allocating associated countries' financial contributions to the Programme, the Commission should take into account the level of participation of legal entities of those third countries in the different parts of the Programme.”

Except in very few Topics that are restricted (and clearly marked as such):

- UK organisations **are** fully eligible to coordinate proposals **and** projects
- UK organisations **are** classed as one of the minimum three different legal entities from three different eligible countries, as long as at least one consortium member is also from a Member State, for proposal **and** project eligibility
- Successful UK organisations **are** funded by EU as project participants/beneficiaries

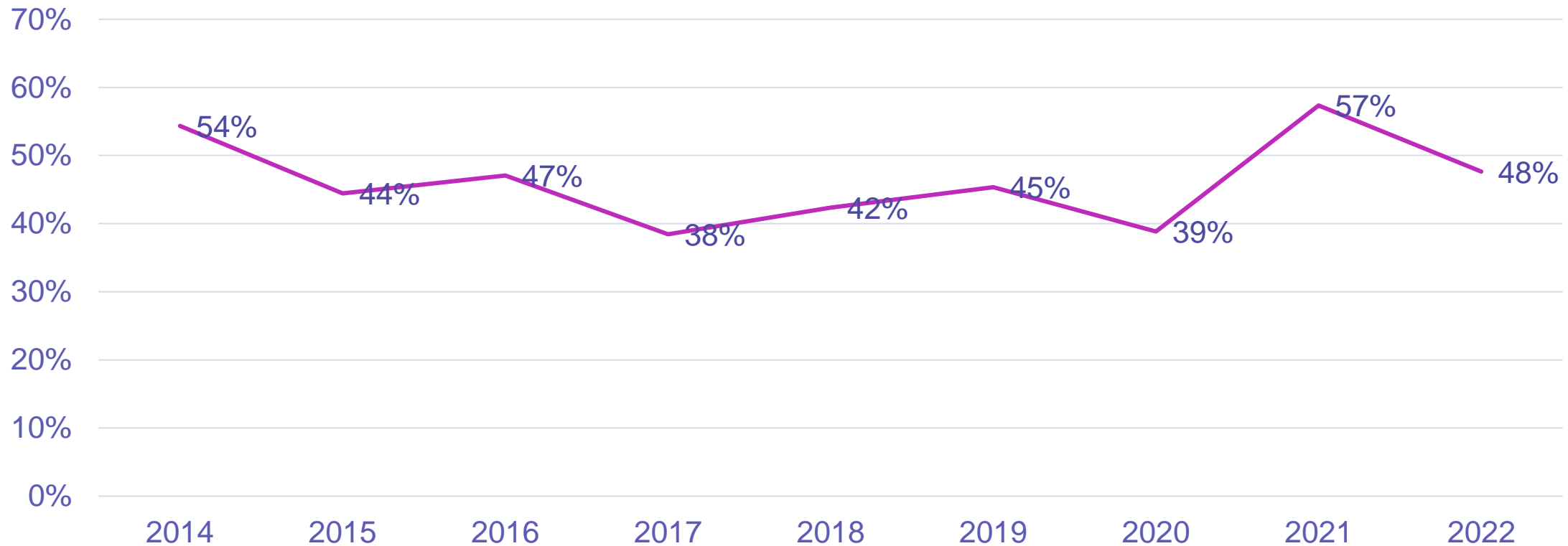

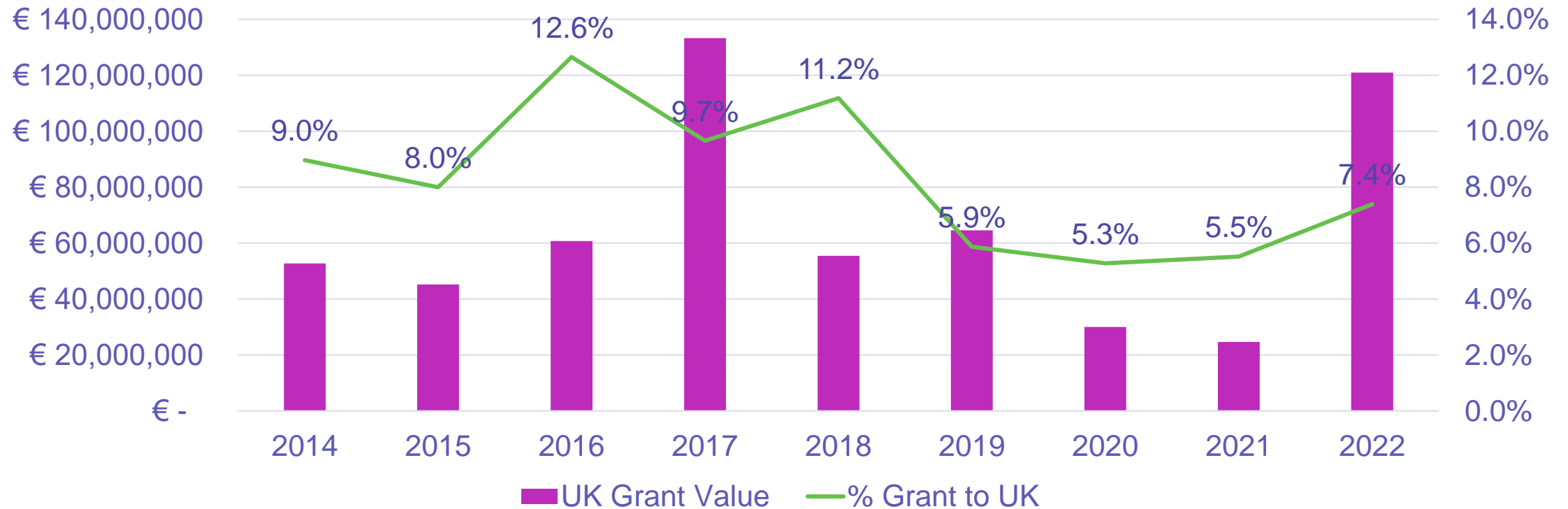
# UK Track Record in Transport Projects



# Proportion of transport projects with UK partners by Call year



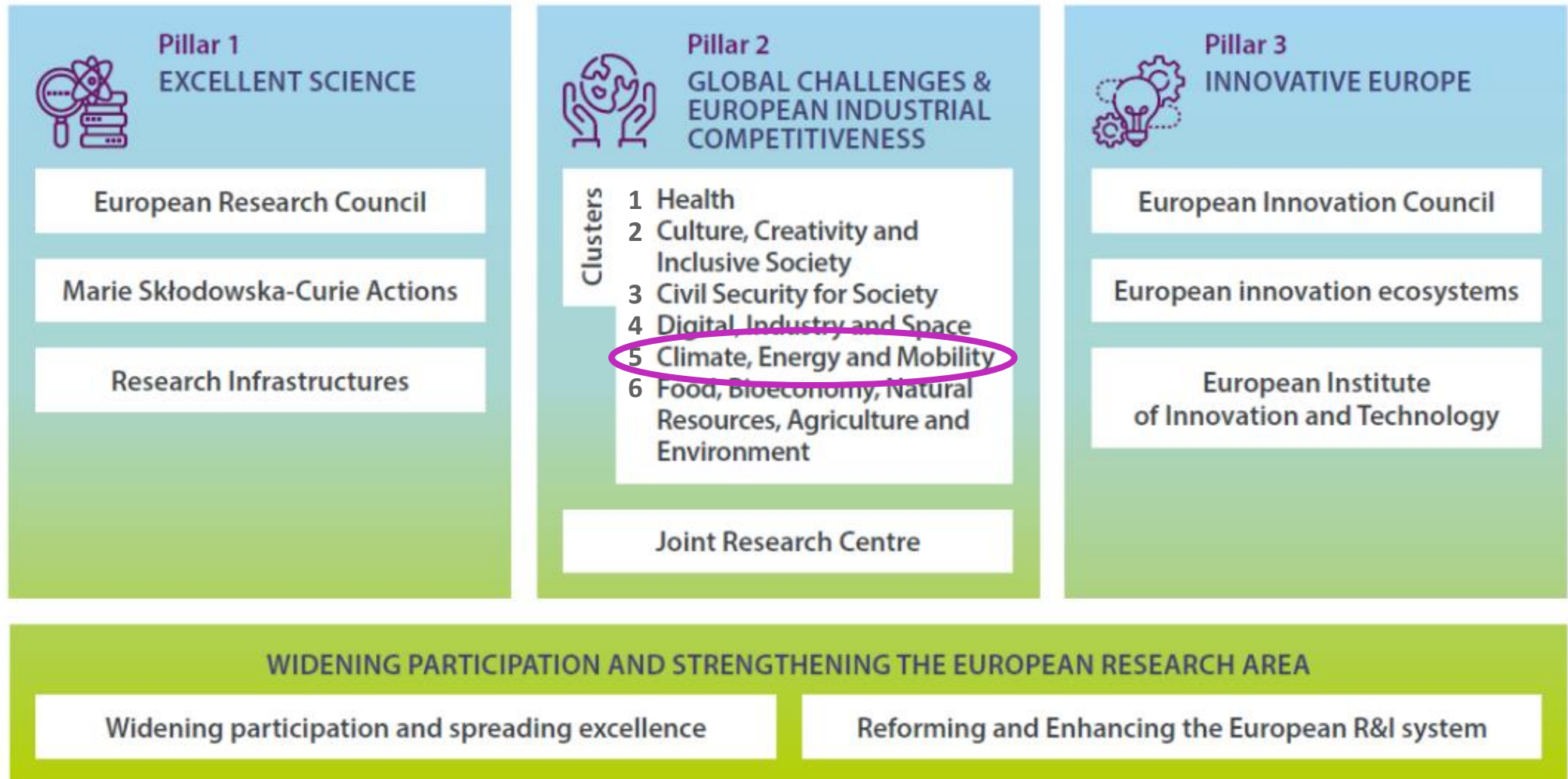
# UK share of available grant funding for transport projects by Call year



Of the 23 CCAM projects listed on Cordis from 2021/2022, 9 have UK partners sharing £5.37m, i.e. average grant is over £500k

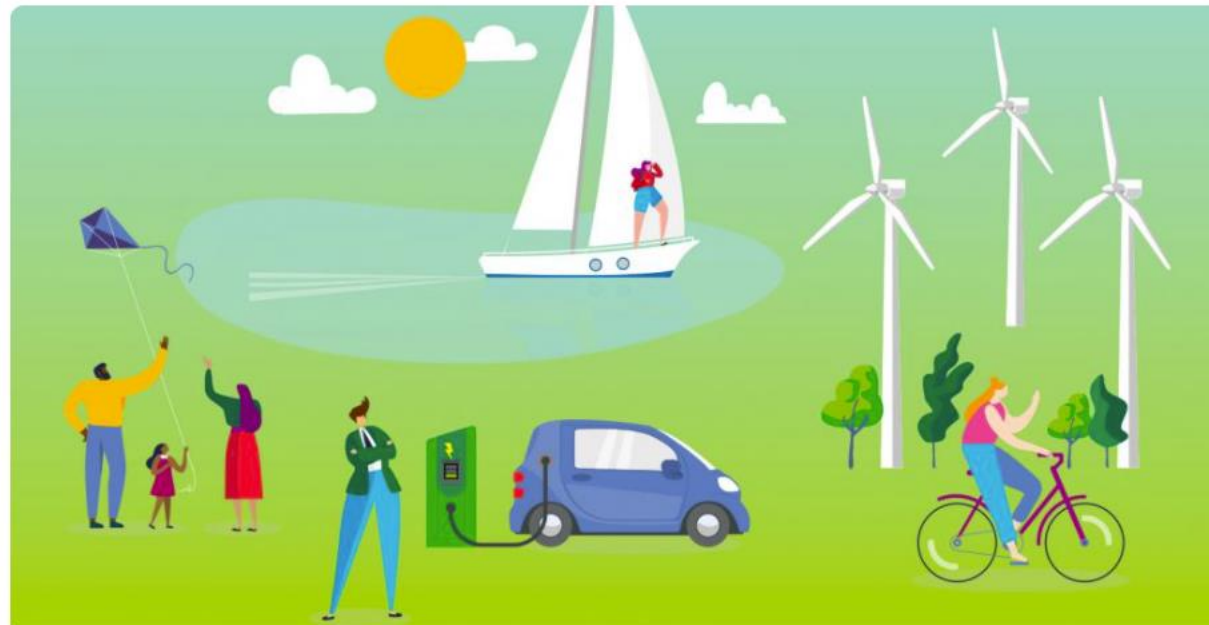

# Cluster 5: Climate, Energy and Mobility

Addresses issues relevant to the twin green and digital transitions and the post-COVID 19 recovery, focussing on the transformation of our economy, industry and society with a view to achieving climate neutrality in Europe by 2050. # Underlying EU Policy

- [The European Green Deal](#) – striving to be the first climate neutral continent by 2050
- [Fit for 55](#) – European climate law makes reaching the EU's climate goal of reducing EU emissions by at least 55% (from 1990) by 2030 a legal obligation
- [EU Digital Strategy](#) – A Europe fit for the digital age.
- The [Digital Europe Programme](#) (DIGITAL) is a new EU funding programme focused on bringing digital technology to businesses, citizens and public administrations
  - Note that although UK organisations cannot access this funding, other consortium partners will and so you need to be aware and informed

# Call for proposals in Destination 6

## HORIZON-CL5-2024-D6-01: Safe, Resilient Transport and Smart Mobility services for passengers and goods

- Connected, Cooperative and Automated Mobility (CCAM)
  - Multi-modal transport, infrastructure and logistics
  - Safety and resilience
  - Cross-cutting actions

# Funding rates and main types of Action

## Research and Innovation Action (RIA)

- Typically, low(ish) Technology Readiness Level
- Consortium of at least three different legal entities from three different eligible countries (all UK legal entities are classed as eligible). At least one consortium member must be from a Member State (MS)
- All participants receive 100% of eligible direct costs plus 25% for indirect costs

## Innovation Action (IA)

- Typically, high(er) Technology Readiness Level
- Consortium of at least three different legal entities from three different eligible countries. At least one must be from a MS
- All not-for-profit participants receive 100% of eligible direct costs plus 25% for indirect costs
- All for-profit participants receive 70% (60% for some co-programmed partnership Topics) of eligible direct costs plus 25% for indirect costs

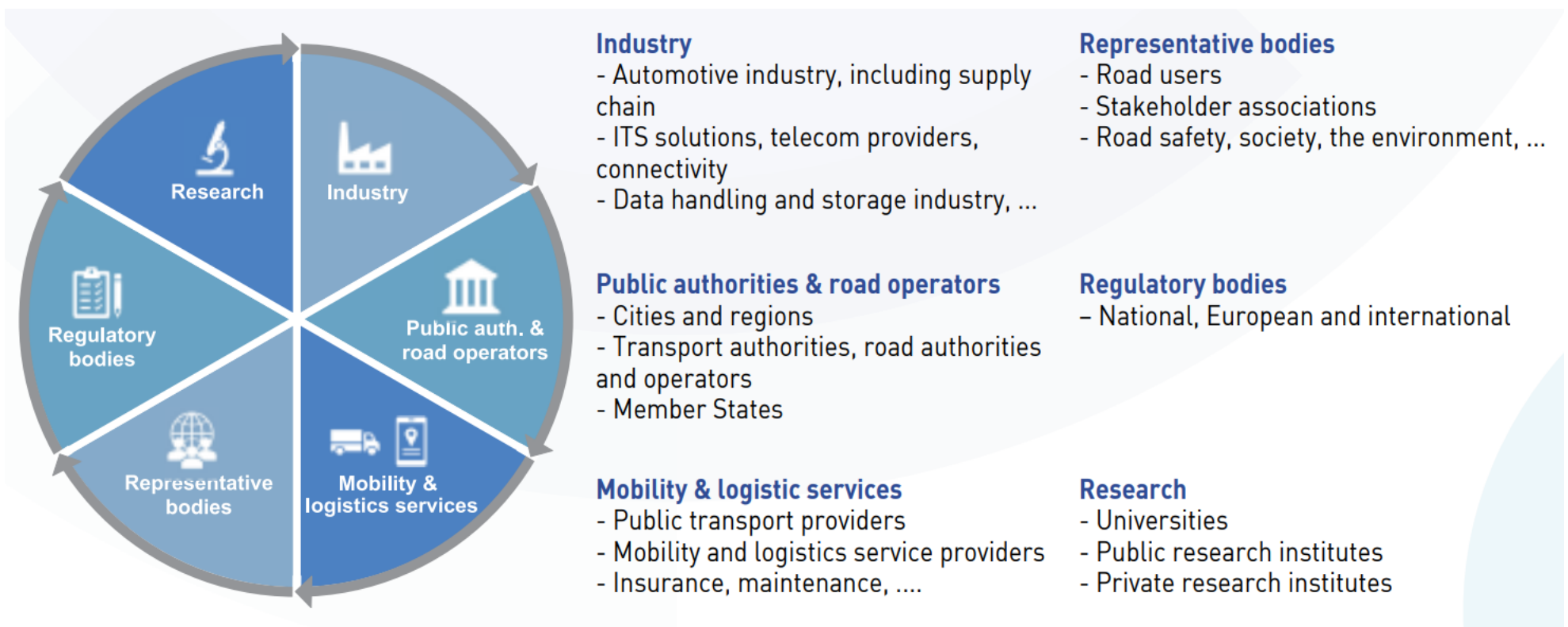
## Coordination and Support Action (CSA)

- As name suggests, for coordinating and supporting activities such as working groups, networking, regulation review, communications, organising EU conferences, etc
- Formally do not need a collaborative approach but often do to meet the scope. Must have at least one partner from a MS
- All participants receive 100% of eligible direct costs plus 25% for indirect costs

# Cooperative, Connected Automated Mobility (CCAM)

- A Co-Programmed Partnership - Members of the partnership develop the Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda ([SRIA](#)) which is used to create the Work Programme (calls for proposals) <https://www.ccam.eu/>

- Create a personal login (top right) then 'Register your organisation' (in 'How to participate') to get a Participant Identification Code (PIC)
- Each Topic (competition) has its own webpage (in '[Search Funding & Tenders](#)') with everything you need to know – read it all (expand the sections to see the More Info...)

# Formal Europe consortium building mechanisms

**Participant portal** – Every topic has a ‘Partner Search’ function where you can upload your profile and review others that have done so

**Partner Search** – under the ‘How to participate tab’ on the EU funding and tender opportunities portal where you can search for past projects and organisations – [Partner Search](#)

**Brokerage tools** – European Commission, Technology Platforms, Co-Programmed Partnerships, Enterprise Europe Network, UK’s KTN, NCPs from around Europe, etc will hold virtual events with e.g., Meeting Mojo, B2B and other tools – [Greenet Partner Search](#)






Searching the formal consortium building mechanisms is a bit like looking for a needle in a needlestack – they all look like needles so finding the ones for you can be difficult

# How to find partners with a track record of success




- Search [Cordis](#) using key words for relevant projects already underway
  - E.g. searching for 'CCAM' returns 23 projects
- 1<sup>st</sup> listed is MOVE2CCAM “MethOds and tools for comprehensive impact Assessment of the CCAM solutions for passengers and goods”
  - Gives project coordinator as BABLE GMBH of Germany and gives the opportunity to contact them and their partners
  - Contact is to the Project Participant, not just a central administrative function
  - Write them a note explaining what you want/intend to do and how their participation would be a great idea



# The best ways to form winning teams

Being an *effective networker* is much more useful than submitting a profile into a portal and awaiting contacts. Don't wait to be invited to the party, push yourself forward

- Use your existing professional networks – if you don't know who the sector leaders are in Europe then you should find out
  - Use Linked In to connect to people from possible consortium partners
- Search [CORDIS](#) for previous, related projects and contact the participants. All projects must disseminate their results and often hold workshops, etc.
- **Join the CCAM Partnership**
  - Be an *active* member – say 'hi' when you join the virtual room. Ask questions, support others' opinions, act as if you are already well known to all in the virtual room
  - Volunteer to draft working papers, take notes, send in useful information – be helpful
  - Speak up at workshops – demonstrate Thought Leadership
  - Show that you would be a valuable partner for collaborative projects and that without you they won't win – you have the secret sauce that is necessary for their success

**EIC Accelerator**

Supporting start-ups and small and medium-sized enterprises to develop and scale up to new markets or disrupt existing ones.



# Features of the EIC Accelerator

- Exclusively for [SMEs](#) with game-changing, high TRL (minimum 5/6) innovation seeking 'world domination', i.e. scale-up
- Single entity applications – no consortia allowed
- Grant of up to €2.5m (at 70%) for project of up to 24 months duration
- Prefinancing – significant % of funding available as the project starts rather than claiming in arrears
- Multiple step application process with feedback at each stage:
  - Step 1: Always open; 10 PowerPoint slides; 3-minute video; answer 5 questions (can reapply once in 12 months)
  - Step 2: Full proposal with business plan (can reapply once in 12 months)
  - Step 3: Jury (Dragon's Den style)
- Note that UK SMEs can only apply to 'Grant Only' and not 'Fund' or 'Grant First'

- Review the [forthcoming CCAM call](#) to determine which (if any) Topic is a ‘fit’ for you (remember you only need to find a bullet point or ‘hook’, not the whole thing)
- Review [Cordis using CCAM as a search term](#) to find out what and who is already funded – contact the interesting/relevant projects/people
- Consider joining CCAM – email Marzena and ask “how can you contribute to the work of the partnership” [marzena.jougounoux@ccam.eu](mailto:marzena.jougounoux@ccam.eu) – you could be part of the team writing the next call for proposals
